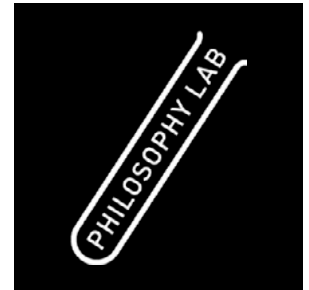
Harry Tappenden
